The Scholarship for Cadet Engineers is open to City of Holyoke residents who have been accepted for admission or are already enrolled in an accredited engineering program. The Cadet Program has allowed HG&E to keep engineering talent local. Currently, 14 full-time HG&E employees came through the program at the start of their careers. 
RATE COMPARISONS

UTILITY CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

As a municipal utility and active member of the community, HG&E is consistently making improvements to the current utility infrastructure, building new services, and forecasting the future utility needs of the community. In an effort to make the community aware of HG&E's construction activities that might impact traffic within our neighborhoods, HG&E has a webpage dedicated to construction activity. Tree Management

Trees enhance the quality of life in our community through aesthetics and keeping the air clean by converting carbon dioxide to oxygen. However, trees and power lines don't mix. Contact between them can cause power outages, fires, and downed lines, while also causing safety hazards for people, wildlife, and the trees themselves. To help keep you safe and provide reliable service in your neighborhood, while ensuring the health of trees, HG&E's professional tree trimming contractors remove or carefully prune trees as needed to create minimum safe distances between electric lines and surrounding trees.

Tree Trimming on Private Property

If a tree on private property is identified as a threat to power lines, HG&E or its contractors will either call you, speak with you in person, or provide you with advance written notice and an opportunity to discuss the project. HG&E is not responsible for trimming or removing trees located on private property. When a tree or branches come down during weather events, the property owner is responsible for removal and clean up, not HG&E. If you are doing tree work on private property near electric service wires, please contact HG&E to evaluate the project. For your safety, a power line may need to be de-energized, dropped, and/or covered for a period of time.

A message from the City of Holyoke Tax Assessors Office

Attention Senior Homeowners

As a homeowner you may qualify for a tax exemption of up to \$1,000 if you meet the following criteria:

- Owned and occupied your home for 5 years as of July 1, 2024
- Age 65 by July 1, 2024 or older
- Taxes must be current
- Must not exceed income and asset guidelines
