What to Expect for Energy Prices This Winter

In an effort to help our customers prepare for winter, we want to provide current estimates for winter heating costs and information on how to reduce energy consumption and bills.

The Unites States Energy Information Administration (EIA) projects that natural gas prices will increase by approximately 35% in 2025 compared to average 2024 prices. This projected increase is due to increased global demand for natural gas while production remains relatively flat. Since we and other local natural gas distribution companies do not manufacture natural gas and must purchase it wholesale from pipelines, our local rates are subject to wholesale price volatility.

Based on these EIA projections, HG&E is estimating that winter natural gas bills will be approximately 15% higher than last winter. This amounts to an increase of approximately \$41 per month for the average residential customer. HG&E's fuel procurement hedging strategy for natural gas allows HG&E to strategically manage costs and insulate HG&E customers, to a degree, from some of the most volatile market conditions.

Although New England depends on natural gas to generate almost 50% of the region's electricity, HG&E is less exposed to price volatility thanks to its diverse electric portfolio. This portfolio includes local hydropower, nuclear entitlements, and other generating assets that don't depend on natural gas for production. As a result, HG&E currently projects no electric rate increases for commercial or residential customers in 2025.


HG&E is proud to offer some of the lowest utility rates in the region and we understand that with inflation and the rising cost of everyday expenses, even the slightest increase in energy rates can have a significant impact on our customers.

Please note that in the winter of 2023/2024, HG&E's residential gas rate was approximately 27% less expensive than peer utilities for the average heating customer within the region, and HG&E's electricity rates were approximately 104% lower; saving the average residential customer approximately \$103/month on natural gas and \$85/month on electricity compared to other utilities. Natural Gas Moratorium

Due to supply constraints during periods of high demand, HG&E issued a natural gas moratorium on all requests for new or increased natural gas service in 2019. Regionally, the demand for natural gas has outpaced supply, leading to several area utility moratoriums. If you are doing any work that involves natural gas equipment in your home



or business, please ask your contractor to contact HG&E before starting any work in order to avoid any confusion. At this time, customers cannot add new natural gas equipment or activate an old or abandoned service.
